



43.5-47: Champoeg State Park



One of the crown jewels of the Oregon State Park system, Champoeg has many facilities: several bathrooms, running water, interpretive facilities, and more. Camping for paddlers is allowed by special arrangement at the grassy bench area above the dock.

About 1/2 mile from the dock (the only access point for paddlers) is a structure commemorating the first provisional government of Oregon. The decision to establish a government was made at Champoeg in 1843 via a vote by a group of newly arrived Americans to the Oregon Territory, along with French-Canadian trappers who were formerly part of the Hudson's Bay Company. The park is also the former site of the town of Champoeg, a bustling river community until the flood of 1861, which swept the town away. (camping by arrangement, interpretive center, and more)

45.5: Parrett Mountain Access (OPRD)



A small greenway park. Not ideal as a put-in or take out.
